



Sport Premium 2016-2017

What is Sport Premium?

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to schools. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age the school has, in January, of that year. The sport premium is to be used to increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, and increasing participation in PE & Sport.

At St. Joseph's RCVA Primary we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils.

The 2016-2017 Sport Premium funding for St Joseph's RCVA Primary School is £8350

The money will be used for:

1) Investing in the Easington School Sport Partnership Service Level Agreement to provide the school with the following: 5000.00

- Liaise with the school to develop an annual bespoke P.E. & Sport action plan.
- Providing curriculum support and high quality CPD for teachers, teaching assistants, NQT's, team teaching, twilights, professional development days etc.
- Provision of High Quality Coaching support across a variety of sports.
- A full organised annual programme of competitions/tournaments/festivals **in addition** to the National School Games.
- Participation, inclusion and excellence opportunities.
- Identifying the gifted & talented children in P.E & Sport

- Provision of an after-school activity in every term in a variety of sports.
- SSP Network meetings to support PE Co-ordinators / PLTs in their role developing PE & sport within their school.

- Identifying opportunities for young leaders to practise their skills through volunteering in schools.

- Assistance in the process of applying for national 'Kitemark' status for High Quality Provision of P.E. & School Sport.

- Promotion and development of links to local sports club.
- Sustain and grow the network of Change4life clubs.
- Central co-ordination of school sport programmes in SSP area.

In addition to the amount allocated, by the government, St. Josephs RCVA Primary have spent more money on sport across school, from the whole school budget.

Impact:

- As a result of the Easington School Sports Partnership pupils have received high quality coaching across a wide range of sports. In some cases, this has led to the children being able to participate in festivals and competitions. This has also had a direct impact on the level of enthusiasm children have shown in sporting activities across the school.
- Staff across the school both in KS1 and in KS2 have received support and coaching in Dance, Gymnastics, Basketball, Tag Rugby, Cricket and Athletics throughout the year and as a result are much more confident in teaching these aspects of the curriculum. They have been provided with lesson plans that can be used moving forward and adapted to meet the needs of their children. Teachers have fed back on CPD in staff meetings to share best practice.
- PE co-ordinator has received support in order to enter the Catholic School Skipping Festival and is able to deliver the training in the future.
- Festivals have given children the opportunity to compete and perform in front of an audience. This had enabled MAT pupils to take part in festivals and competitions linked to their interests and strengths. This year children have participated in the following, Cross-country, Key Steps, Gymnastics, Swimming Gala, Hoopstarz, KS1 Football, Dance, Basketball, Catholic Skipping School Festival and Outdoor Adventurous Activities.
- After School Clubs have increased interest and are increasingly attended. This has given the opportunity for all children to participate in after school PE clubs.
Attendance across the year is as follows:
Football with Brian Honour- Autumn 14 Spring 14 Summer 13
Swimming- 14
Gymnastics- 6
Football ESSP- 11



Teachers and club coordinators report raised confidence, self-esteem, improved skills and fitness levels. Increasing numbers of children are prepared to try new activities in Pe lessons as well as in after school clubs.

56% of children participate in sports clubs outside of school.

10% of children attend Brian Honour football coaching and clubs following the sessions attended in school

16% of children attend swimming lessons

- All Year 2 children had the opportunity to attend swimming lessons in preparation for curriculum swimming in KS2.
- All children enjoy upwards of 2 hours of PE per week.
- We have maintained Silver in the Sainsbury's School Games Mark.
